According to petition, debtors' debts are primarily consumer in nature. Once appropriate adjustments are made, it appears that debtors have sufficient disposable income to pay \$1,535.54 per month, or \$92,132.40, over the life of a 5-year plan. This equates to approximately 70 percent of scheduled unsecured debts. On these facts, there is presumed abuse that has not been rebutted. Grant motion and dismiss case for substantial abuse under section 707(b)(2).

#3.00 Hearing re: Issuance of a Preliminary Injunction

Tentative Ruling:

Judge Bason entered a temporary restraining order. (See docket no. 17, entered May 22, 2025.) He set a hearing on issuance of a preliminary injunction which Judge Bluebond continued to June 5, 2025 at 10:00 a.m. The Court understands that the foreclosing lender has agreed to refrain from moving forward with a foreclosure of the Villa until the Court has had an opportunity to rule on its motion to dismiss. In the interim, the Court understands that the trustee would like to have a preliminary injunction issued as against the remaining defendants.

The debtor's Schedule I and J reflect that he has monthly expenses of \$108,150 euros and zero income. How has the debtor been paying his living expenses? (He says he has been operating a business, but has had zero income for the last three years.) He shows unsecured claims totalling more than \$840,000,000, which include the following:

- 1. a \$20,000,000 judgment in favor of Vitaly Slvanovich Smagin;
- 2. a \$198,000,000 judgment in favor of Vitaly Gogokhia in London;

3. a judgment for more than \$5.3 million in favor of Flemming Zulack et al and a related trust;

4. damages of \$608,100,000 in favor of Dmitry Garkusha Vladimirovich, whose address is in France; and

5. legal fees of \$3.4 million in favor of an attorney in Paris.

He lists interests in no fewer than 21 entities. With one exception, all of these entities are shown as having zero value. The one exception is valued at \$50,000,000.
