1. CDTFA contends its claim is based on "dual liability" or "dual determination" under Cal. Rev & Tax Code § 6829. Does the Debtor stipulate that the Debtor is a "responsible person" (as defined in § 6829) of Alpha Omega Enterprises, Inc. ("Alpha Omega") or is that in dispute? If this is one of the issues going to trial, do the parties agree on:
 - a. Who bears the burden of proof?
 - b. The legal elements that each party is required to establish for the Court to find that the Debtor is a responsible person of Alpha Omega?
 - c. What is the standard of proof required on those elements? Preponderance of the evidence? Clear and convincing?
 - d. What are the legal authorities that support the parties' positions on these issues?

2. Clearly the parties dispute the proper amount of the tax owed. Do the parties agree on the following, and if not, where do they agree?
 - a. Who bears the burden of proof on the amount of the tax owed?
 - b. Is that burden a shifting burden? If so, how does that work?
 - c. What is the standard of proof? Preponderance of the evidence? Clear and convincing?
 - d. What are the legal authorities that support the parties' positions on these issues?

3. Is Alpha Omega the only corporate taxpayer at issue or is there a dispute between the parties regarding whether a portion of the proof of claim is based on sales by Equiptool Inc.? If so, will whether Dtr is a "responsible person" of Equiptool be one of the issues at issue at trial?
