Tentative Ruling:

This matter is before the Court on motions to dismiss the first amended complaint (the "FAC") [Adv. Dkt. 42] of plaintiff Matteo Patisso ("Plaintiff"). The motions to dismiss (the "Motions") were filed by the following defendants: BRG Enterprises dba Kings Auction and Capital Auction Productions, and Catherine King [Adv. Dkt. 45]; David Lasco, Alain Vinson, and Vinson Investments LLC [Adv. Dkt. 46]; Larry Hershfield [Adv. Dkt. 47]; and Jackson Strong Alliance, LLC, Brett Livingstone Strong (the "Debtor"), and Stason Strong [Adv. Dkt. 48] (collectively, "Defendants"). Having reviewed the Motions, Plaintiff's various documents filed in response to the motions [Adv. Dkts. 71, 75, 76, 77, 78, 84, 86, 87, 88], Defendants' replies [Adv. Dkts. 94, 85, 96, 97], and the record in this adversary proceeding and the related bankruptcy case, for the reasons stated herein, the Motions will be granted; the Court will dismiss the FAC in its entirety without leave to amend.

In the FAC, Plaintiff alleges that his purported predecessor in interest, Liquid Brick, Inc., purchased from the chapter 7 trustee assets of the Debtor's bankruptcy estate, namely, original artworks by the late pop-star musician, Michael Jackson. Plaintiff's FAC seeks; (1) turnover of this alleged estate property under 11 U.S.C. § 542(a), (2) declaratory relief that the property belongs to him, and (3) injunctive relief against any further actions with respect to the property.

A complaint must contain sufficient factual matter, if accepted as true, to state a claim for relief that is plausible on its face. Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(b)(6); *see also* Fed. R. Bankr. P. 7012 (providing that Fed. R. Civ. P. 12 applies in an adversary proceeding). A pleading that offers only labels, conclusions, or a formulaic recitation of the elements of a cause of action is insufficient. *Bell Atl. Corp. v. Twombly*, 550 U.S. 544, 555–57 (2007). In assessing the sufficiency of a complaint, the court "may also consider [1] materials that are submitted with and attached to the complaint; [2] judicial notice of matters of public record; and [3] unattached evidence on which the complaint necessarily relies if: [a] the complaint refers to the document; [b] the document is central to the plaintiff's claim; and [c] no party questions the authenticity of the document." *Beverly Oaks Physicians Surgical Ctr., LLC v. Blue Cross & Blue*

Shield of Ill., 983 F.3d 435, 439 (9th Cir. 2020) (quoting *United States v. Corinthian Colls.*, 655 F.3d 984, 998–99 (9th Cir. 2011) (internal quotation marks omitted). For the reasons stated herein, the Court finds that the FAC fails to state a claim upon which relief can be granted.

As an initial matter, Plaintiff does not have standing to seek any of the relief requested, as it all depends on the purported sale of works of art by Michael Jackson under the "Coagreement of Purchase and Sale" approved by this Court in 2007. Case Dkt. 222-1 at 2–12 (the "Sale Agreement"). The Sale Agreement states:

This Agreement and all rights of Buyer [Liquid Brick, Inc.] arising hereunder shall not be assigned, sold, pledged or otherwise transferred by Buyer in whole or in part, and any attempted assignment, sale, pledge or transfer by Buyer shall be null and void and be deemed a default hereunder.

Case Dkt. 222-1 at 9 (§ 15 of Sale Agreement).

Plaintiff is not Liquid Brick, Inc., and as a purported assignee of Liquid Brick, Inc., he cannot enforce any rights under the Sale Agreement by the plain, unambiguous terms of that contract. Accordingly, Plaintiff's claims in the FAC are not plausible and must be dismissed.

Moreover, Plaintiff does not have statutory standing to seek turnover under 11 U.S.C. § 542(a). That section of the Bankruptcy Code empowers "the trustee" to seek turnover, and it is limited to turnover of "property of the estate." *See In re Hernandez*, 483 B.R. 713, 725 (B.A.P. 9th Cir. 2012) ("Section 542(a) enables the bankruptcy trustee, or the debtor-in-possession in a reorganization case to seek turnover of the debtors' assets"). Plaintiff does not qualify as a trustee. *See* 11 U.S.C. § 321. Moreover, the works of art that were property of the estate are no longer subject to turnover because they were sold by the chapter 7 trustee during the pendency of the Debtor's bankruptcy case. *See* 11 U.S.C. § 541.

Standing aside, none of Plaintiff's claims are ones upon which the Court could plausibly grant his requested relief because they are unambiguously contradicted by the sale documents on which he relies. Despite Plaintiff's contentions in the FAC, the sale documents did not provide "an illustrative, non-exhaustive list" of the property sold to his purported predecessor in interest. Adv. Dkt. 42 at 8 (¶ 36). The sale documents expressly identified the works of art that comprised the property sold to Liquid Brick, Inc. That list does not include any works of art by Michael Jackson. Further, nothing in the sale documents indicates the list is illustrative and not exhaustive of the assets sold. *See* Case Dkt. 222 at 14-22 (complete list of works of

art and lithographic prints that comprised the Property). The Court need not accept Plaintiff's conclusory allegations, unwarranted deductions or unreasonable inferences to the contrary. *See Sprewell v. Golden State Warriors*, 266 F.3d 979, 988 (9th Cir. 2001), *amended on other grounds*, 275 F.3d 1187 (9th Cir. 2001). Accordingly, Plaintiff does not have standing to seek the relief sought in the FAC with respect to any works of art by Michael Jackson.

Plaintiff posits a variety of theories as to why he nevertheless is entitled to the works of art by Michael Jackson. He contends such works were somehow undisclosed assets of the Debtor's bankruptcy estate. Even if that were true, Plaintiff would not be entitled to those assets simply because they were undisclosed assets of the Debtor's bankruptcy estate. The chapter 7 trustee would. Again, Plaintiff's purported predecessor in interest bought from the chapter 7 trustee only the works of art specified in the Sale Agreement. The record of the sale contradicts the assertion that any works of art by Michael Jackson were transferred to Plaintiff or his purported predecessor in interest.

Finally, the works of art by Michael Jackson have been sold pursuant to orders of the state court in *Vinson Investments LLC v. Bret [sic] Livingstone Strong*, LASC No. 20SMCV00872. Dkt. 45 at 99–101 (state court's Mar. 7, 2025 minute order approving sale of Michael Jackson artwork to Vinson Investments LLC via credit bid). As set forth in this Court's order to show cause (the "OSC"), Case Dkt. 269, and the record in this adversary proceeding, Plaintiff clearly was aware of the ongoing sale process in state court. Plaintiff filed an objection with the state court, asserting that the auction and credit bid were improper because his purported predecessor in interest, Liquid Brick, Inc., purportedly acquired the art from the chapter 7 trustee in the Debtor's bankruptcy case. *See Adv. Dkt. 40-4 at 6*. And after the state court approved the sale of Michael Jackson artwork to Vinson Investments LLC, via a credit bid, Plaintiff unsuccessfully sued the state court judge and auctioneer in federal district court. *Patisso v. Epstein et al.*, No. 2:25-cv-01666-MWCKES (C.D. Cal. Apr. 7, 2025) (order *sua sponte* dismissing action without leave to amend), *appeal dismissed*, No. 25-3252 (9th Cir. July 31, 2025). The district court dismissed Plaintiff's action as violative of the *Rooker-Feldman* doctrine, *see id.*, and this Court will do the same. *See Rooker v. Fidelity Trust Co.*, 263 U.S. 413, 415–16 (1923) (deciding district courts may not exercise appellate jurisdiction over state courts).

Accordingly, the FAC does not state a plausible claim under any legal theory that Plaintiff is entitled to any works of art by Michael Jackson. The Court finds that further amendment would be futile. Plaintiff already has amended his complaint once and continues to rely on the same fundamentally flawed premise that he is entitled to works of art by Michael Jackson—notwithstanding prior decisions of the state court,
