1. Feasibility appears to be a concern. Debtor's projections reflect a positive cash flow of \$68,556 or \$5,713 per month for the first year of the Plan. This amount, however, is not reflective of Debtor's performance while in Chapter 11. Having reviewed the last five months of filed MORs [Dks. 42, 44, 55. 56, and 58], the average monthly net cash flow appears to be only \$518.65, which is insufficient to make the regular monthly plan payments of \$5,428.88 (which amount reflects a reduced plan payment to unsecured creditors and an increased payment to DFTA).

Further, even if the projected amounts were accurate, it is questionable whether they are sufficient to satisfy the required payments under the Plan, which total \$5,428.88 per month, leaving only approximately \$283 in disposable income. The projections only reference the payments to the secured claimants; payments to priority and unsecured payments were not included. Had they been, the foregoing would have been readily apparent.

The purpose of the feasibility requirement "is to prevent confirmation of visionary schemes which promise creditors and equity security holders more under a proposed plan than the debtor can possibly attain after confirmation." *Pizza of Haw., Inc. v. Shakey's, Inc. (In re Pizza of Haw., Inc.),* 761 F.2d 1374, 1382 (9th Cir. 1985). When confirmation is sought under § 1191(b), as it is here, a "harder look at feasibility that [is] otherwise conducted under § 1129(a)(11) alone" is required. *Hamilton v. Curiel (In re Curiel),* 651 B.R. 548, 561 (9th Cir. B.A.P. 2023).

Debtor does not appear to have met the foregoing standard. No substantive explanation as to how the projected income was derived is provided.

2. The Plan appears to contain an error. It provides that Class 3(a) Unsecured claims will be paid in 60 monthly payments of \$1,112 for a total of \$33,892. 60 payments of \$1,112, however, equals \$66,720. See, Dk. 49, pg. 6 of 20. The Court notes the Trustee's comments that the amount should only be \$564.87 per month (which amount was used by the Court when caculating the required monthly payments under the Plan).

3. As a result of the foregoing feasibility concerns, it is unclear whether Debtor

will be able to pay Debtor's counsel's fees and the Subchapter V Trustee's fees, cumulatively estimated to be approximately \$37,000, the payment of which is due on the later of the Effective Date or Court approval of such fees. The latest filed MOR [Dk. 58] indicates that Debtor only has \$9,500.94 in cash. If January or February are negative cash flow months, the cash on hand may decrease.

4. The Plan does not provide if, when, or how property of Debtor revests if the Plan is confirmed under § 1191(b).

If the Amended Plan is not confirmed, the Court may continue both this matter, and the related status conference, to March 5, 2025, at 1:30 p.m., with a Second Amended Plan due by no later than February 5, 2025. Oppositions are due by February 19, 2025, and replies and status conference reports from both Debtor and the Subchapter V Trustee are due by February 26, 2025.

Alternatively, if the Amended Pan is confirmed, the Court is inclined to set a postconfirmation status conference on May 7, 2025, at 11:00 a.m., with a status report due 14 days in advance.
