Tentative for 6/2/26:

The Application [Dk. 248] is APPROVED as requested, and Debtor's Opposition [Dk. 260] is OVERRULED. Grobstein Teeple's requested final fees are APPROVED in the amount of \$50,018.50.

Under 11 U.S.C. § 330(a)(1), the court may award reasonable compensation for actual, necessary services rendered by a professional employed under § 327. In determining reasonableness, the court considers the nature, extent, and value of the services, including the time spent, rates charged, whether the services were necessary to administration of the case or beneficial when rendered, whether the services were performed within a reasonable time commensurate with the task, and whether the compensation is reasonable compared to customary compensation for comparably skilled practitioners. 11 U.S.C. § 330(a)(3). The court also considers whether the services were authorized, adequately documented, and supported by reasonable billing judgment. *Roberts, Sheridan & Kotel, P.C. v. Bergen Brunswick Drug Co. (In re Mednet)*, 251 B.R. 103, 108 (9th Cir. BAP 2000); *In re Garcia*, 335 B.R. 717, 724 (9th Cir. BAP 2005); *In re Strand*, 375 F.3d 854, 860 (9th Cir. 2004). The services need not produce a material recovery in hindsight if they were reasonably likely to benefit the estate when rendered. *Mednet*, 251 B.R. at 108. The court also has an independent duty to review fee requests. *Lobel &*

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Opera v. U.S. Tr. (In re Auto Parts Club, Inc.), 211 B.R. 29, 33 (9th Cir. BAP 1997).

Grobstein Teeple was employed as Debtor's CPA / business valuation expert related to TTW Transport v. David Revolorio, et al., Adv. No. 8:24-ap-01074-SC. The Court approved that employment on the terms set forth in the Employment Application [Dk. 60]. The approved engagement was not limited to a single valuation calculation; it contemplated expert analysis concerning the value of Debtor's business, alleged "bad acts," prejudgment-interest issues, potential misappropriation of assets, and other financial issues.

Debtor objects that only \$4,165.00 is separately categorized as "Valuation," while the balance is categorized as "Litigation Consulting." The Court does not treat that billing label as dispositive. The billing records reflect substantive forensic, valuation, damages, and report-preparation work, including review of forensic reports, tax returns, ledger materials, sales activity, customer data, damages analysis, valuation exhibits, report text, and report review. Viewed in context, those services are consistent with the approved expert role and were reasonably necessary to evaluate and prosecute estate claims involving the alleged transfer of Debtor's business as a going concern and related financial issues.

The absence of an ultimate Revolorio recovery does not warrant reduction. The Court evaluates benefit at the time the services were rendered, not solely by hindsight. *Mednet*, 251 B.R. at 108; *Strand*, 375 F.3d at 860. Here, the Application, billing records, and case posture support a finding that the services were reasonably likely to benefit the estate when performed. The fees are allowable based on the approved scope of employment, the nature of the work reflected in the billing records, and the litigation posture at the time the services were performed.

The Application is APPROVED as requested, and Debtor's Preliminary Opposition [Dk. 259] is OVERRULED. Polis & Associates' ("Polis") requested final fees are APPROVED in the amount of \$47,605.00.

Under 11 U.S.C. § 330(a)(1), the court may award reasonable compensation for actual, necessary services rendered by a professional employed under § 327. In determining reasonableness, the court considers the nature, extent, and value of the services, including the time spent, rates charged, whether the services were necessary to administration of the case or beneficial when rendered, and whether the services were performed within a reasonable time commensurate with the task. 11 U.S.C. § 330(a)(3). The court also has an independent duty to review fee requests. *Lobel & Opera v. U.S. Tr. (In re Auto Parts Club, Inc.)*, 211 B.R. 29, 33 (9th Cir. BAP 1997).

Debtor does not identify specific time entries or categories of work that are unnecessary, duplicative, clerical, excessive, or otherwise noncompensable. Debtor instead requests clarification regarding a prepetition arbitration agreement between Debtor and Polis.

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Debtor's request does not provide a basis to defer or deny the Application. Debtor relies on a November 30, 2023 prepetition retainer agreement, but Polis responds that the operative Chapter 11 retainer agreement is dated February 28, 2024 and expressly contemplated fee applications in this Court, notice to TTW, TTW's opportunity to object, and separate counsel at any fee hearing. In any event, the matter before the Court is allowance of compensation for court-approved bankruptcy counsel under §§ 327 and 330. The cited arbitration provision does not displace this Court's statutory fee-review function. See 11 U.S.C. § 330(a); *Auto Parts Club*, 211 B.R. at 33.

The billing records reflect services within the approved role of Debtor's counsel, including case administration, claims work, plan-related work, and structured dismissal. The hours and rates are not facially unreasonable given the case history and the results achieved.

Tentative Ruling:

Tentative for 6/2/26 is to APPROVE as requested.

The Court has reviewed the First Interim Fee Application and finds the requested fees and expenses reasonable and necessary. See 11 U.S.C. §§ 330(a)(1)(A), 331; *In re Auto Parts Club, Inc.*, 211 B.R. 29, 33 (9th Cir. BAP 1997). Gomez's Limited Opposition [Dk. 186] does not identify any specific billing entries as unreasonable, unnecessary, excessive, or otherwise noncompensable, but instead argues only that payment is premature pending adjudication of his asserted reimbursement claim under California Family Code § 2640.

The Court is not persuaded that the pending Family Code § 2640 dispute prevents allowance or payment of interim administrative expenses. Under 11 U.S.C. § 541(a)(2), all undivided community property becomes property of the bankruptcy estate upon the petition date, and such property remains estate property unless and until a state court enters a final division order. *Dumas v. Mantle (In re Mantle)*, 153 F.3d 1082, 1085 (9th Cir. 1998). The Bankruptcy Code further expressly authorizes the payment of allowed administrative expenses from estate property, including community property, and grants such claims priority over other claims. See 11 U.S.C. §§ 503(b); *Microsoft Corp. v. DAK Industries (In re DAK Industries)*, 66 F.3d 1091, 1094 (9th Cir. 1995) (administrative-expense claims have priority over other unsecured

claims); see *also* 11 U.S.C. §§ 507(a)(2) and 726(a)(1) (providing that allowed administrative expenses are paid first in distribution). Nothing in § 2640 or the pendency of the stay-relief motion alters the estate status of the undivided community-property proceeds or bars the Trustee from seeking interim compensation from estate assets.

Moreover, as pointed out in the Reply [Dk. 189], it appears that Gomez previously agreed in the Sale Stipulation [Dk. 129] to subordinate his asserted interests to the payment of administrative costs, including Trustee and professional fees.

Accordingly, the Court is inclined to OVERRULE Gomez' Limited Opposition and APPROVE Trustee's fees as requested.

The Court is inclined to GRANT the Motion.

The Chapter 7 Trustee seeks approval under 9019 of two settlement agreements resolving lien disputes affecting proceeds from the sale of Debtor's residence located at 27591 Kathy Court, Laguna Niguel, California (the "Property").

The motion arises from competing claims asserted on the Property by Stegmeier, Gelbart, Schwartz and Benavente, LLP ("SGSB"), which recorded a \$300,000 Family Law Attorney Real Property Lien ("FLARPL") on January 5, 2023, and White Zuckerman Warsavsky Luna and Hunt, LLP ("Hunt"), which obtained a judgment against the Debtor for \$77,396.19 and recorded an abstract of judgment on June 30, 2023.

According to the Motion, SGSB will be paid \$240,000.00 on its FLARPL and the remaining \$60,000 of its asserted FLARPL claim will be subordinated to allowed administrative and general unsecured claims, with the subordinated lien transferred to the Estate pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 510(c)(2). Similarly, Hunt shall reduce its claim and lien asserted against Debtor's portion of the Property sale proceeds from \$77,396.19 to \$50,000.00, freeing approximately \$27,396.19 for unsecured creditors.

Trustee has satisfied the A & C factors and demonstrated that the proposed compromises are fair and equitable, and in the best interests of the estate.

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See Woodson v. Fireman's Fund Ins. Co. (In re Woodson), 839 F.2d 610, 620 (9th Cir. 1988); *Martin v. Kane (In re A & C Props.)*, 784 F.2d 1377, 1381 (9th Cir. 1986), *cert. denied sub. nom. Martin v. Robinson*, 479 U.S. 854 (1986).

In determining the fairness, reasonableness and adequacy of a proposed settlement agreement, the court considers (a) the probability of success in the litigation; (b) the difficulties, if any, to be encountered in the matter of collection; (c) the complexity of the litigation involved, and the expense, inconvenience and delay necessarily attending it; (d) the paramount interest of the creditors and a proper deference to their reasonable views in the premises. *In re A & C Properties*, 784 F.2d 1377, 1381 (9th Cir. 1986).

Regarding the probability of success in litigation, Trustee acknowledges there are colorable disputes concerning the enforceability, extent, and priority of the SGSB FLARPL and Hunt lien. However, the settlements avoid the risks and uncertainty of continued litigation while providing concrete value to the Estate, including the subordination of \$60,000 of SGSB's asserted secured claim and reduction of Hunt's lien from \$77,396.19 to \$50,000.

Collection concerns are alleviated, as the disputed sale proceeds are already under Trustee's control and available for administration. As for the complexity of the litigation, the disputes involve overlapping bankruptcy, family-law, lien-priority, and adversary proceeding issues. Continued litigation would likely require substantial additional attorneys' fees and delay administration of the Estate and distributions to creditors, weighing strongly in favor of compromise.

As to the interests of creditors, the settlements materially increase the funds available for unsecured creditors while avoiding further litigation costs. Trustee represents that the SGSB settlement alone nearly doubles the funds available for unsecured creditor distributions, and the Hunt settlement further increases the value available to the Estate.

Debtor's ex-husband Jeffrey Gomez filed a Limited Opposition [Dk. 186], directing his objections to the timing of the Motion and the source of payment, not to Trustee's general authority to administer property of the estate. He argues that his asserted Family Code § 2640 reimbursement claim has not

been liquidated or adjudicated and therefore the source of payment is disputed, rendering the Motion premature.

The pendency of Gomez' asserted Family Code § 2640 reimbursement claim does not render the Motion premature. Under 11 U.S.C. § 541(a)(2), undivided community property enters the bankruptcy estate upon the petition date and remains estate property unless and until divided by a state court order. See *Brace v. Speier (In re Brace)*, 979 F.3d 1228, 1230–31 (9th Cir. 2020); *Dumas v. Mantle (In re Mantle)*, 153 F.3d 1082, 1085 (9th Cir. 1998). Thus, even assuming Gomez may later establish some entitlement to reimbursement under Family Code § 2640, the Kathy Court sale proceeds presently remain estate property subject to administration by Trustee.

Moreover, as noted in the Reply [Dk. 189], under the Sale Stipulation [Dk. 129], the parties agreed that, following payment of senior liens, administrative costs, broker commissions, and related sale expenses, the remaining homestead proceeds would be divided into "Debtor's Share" and "Gomez's Share." Trustee represents that Debtor further agreed to limit and waive portions of "Debtor's Share" as necessary to satisfy administrative expenses and allowed unsecured claims, other than Gomez's claim, and Gomez subordinated his liens or interests to Administrative Costs. Trustee therefore contends that the present compromises affect only "Debtor's Share" of the proceeds and do not impair "Gomez's Share." To be clear, the SGSB compromise concerns the FLARPL against Debtor's Share; it does not resolve SGSB's separate abstract judgment against Gomez's Share.

Accordingly, because the compromises concern Debtor's Share, not Gomez's Share, and Gomez's asserted § 2640 claim does not convert the sale proceeds into his separate property before division, the Court does not find the Motion premature. The Court therefore is inclined to OVERRULE the Limited Opposition and GRANT the Motion.
